## **College & Career Readiness**

Students in 11th and 12th grade at Riverside High School have the opportunity to attend one of the leading career and technical schools in the area, Auburn Career Center. Students also have the opportunity to earn college credits at Lakeland Community College while still in high school at no cost through the College Credit Plus program.

To gain real-life experience, 10th and 11th graders are encouraged to participate in College and Career Shadow Day, when students visit local businesses and organizations to learn about various professions. Seniors are encouraged to participate in Senior Project, which allows students to shadow a career of their choice for two weeks.

We are committed to preparing students for life after graduation by implementing several programs that help students determine careers they are interested in exploring.

Students at LaMuth Middle School and Riverside Campus use Naviance, which is a comprehensive college and career readiness solution that helps schools align student strengths and interests to post-secondary goals.

Staff members also developed a Riverside Road Map, which is a guide for students in grades 4-12 that helps prepare students for their future. The Riverside Road Map focuses on students bettering themselves, pursuing greatness and developing leadership qualities.





## 21st Century Learner

Students in grades 6 through 12 are given a Chromebook to use at school and at home as part of the District's 1:1 Initiative to provide tools and resources for the 21st Century Learner. Elementary students also have access to Chromebooks in the classroom.

## **AP SCHOLARS**



## Arts

Participation in performing and visual arts inspires students' creativity, problem solving and critical thinking skills.

Riverside Campus offers a robust art program that showcases student artwork not only in the classroom, but also throughout the entire community. Highlights every year include:

- Painting Painesville Township snow plows that are displayed at local festivals, community parades and used to plow snow during the winter time.
- Participating in the Lake & Geauga Educational Assistance Foundations' The Umbrella Project, where students design and paint umbrellas to be judged by community artists and displayed at the Great Lakes Mall.
- Participating in the Cleveland Clinic Expressions Program, where students create artwork based off science and medical research.
- Hosting art shows at First Federal of Lakewood Bank and Stella's Art Gallery.
- Decorating the sidewalks surrounding Riverside Campus during the annual Chalk Festival.
- Creating ceramic bowls to donate to the Northeast Ohio Empty Bowls Project, which is a program that focuses on fighting hunger in the community.
- Displaying student artwork at community festivals throughout the year.

At the elementary level, students host various plays, musicals and programs for family members throughout the year. Elementary choir concerts are also held at Riverside High School.



## **Student Leadership and Activities**

A well-rounded education includes a wide variety of opportunities.

Our students throughout the District are committed to leadership and giving back to the community in the following ways:

- Riverside Campus students raise thousands of dollars annually for Day of Caring to help families in need.
- Students routinely volunteer for community service projects through Riverside High School's Community Service Honor Cord program.
- Students at LaMuth Middle School and all of our elementary schools raise money and organize food drives for many local nonprofits.
- Riverside High School hosts two blood drives for American Red Cross every year.
- Riverside High School launched the Best Buds Club, which is a student-led club to create friendships between regular-ed and special-ed students.
- Many students at Riverside High School participate in the SIDE Leadership program, which stands for Student Initiative for Developing Excellence. The group focuses on mentoring, being ambassadors and leaders. The group was recognized at the Ohio Schools Board Association Conference in November of 2019.



- More than 40 students were inducted into the Riverside High School National Honor Society during the 2019-2020 school year.
- Four 2020 graduating seniors enlisted in the military.





# **Fiscal Stewardship**







- Our District received \$184,667.73 in Student Wellness and Success funds from the Ohio Department of Education to support students' academic achievement through mental health counseling, wraparound services, mentoring, and after-school programs.
- We are a member of the Ohio Schools Council and participates in several programs to obtain goods and services at highly competitive pricing including:
  - Competitive bidding for the purchase of school buses, diesel fuel, food products, and cafeteria items.
  - OSC Natural Gas Program
  - Power4Schools Electric Program
  - OSC Waste and Recycling Program
- Our District was awarded \$17,394.75 in safety grant funds from the Ohio Attorney General's Office. These funds were used to install camera systems in five school buses. The camera systems included four interior cameras and two exterior cameras to capture school bus stop arm violations.
- Our District received \$426,070 in net funding through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act passed by the Federal government in March 2020. The District will utilize these funds in Fiscal Year 2021 to offset increased expenditures due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the District's state funding was cut 13.4% or \$1,119,054.57 late in the fiscal year resulting in the District paying funds back to the State of Ohio. However, in response to the significant state funding cuts unfairly weighted to districts such as Riverside, the Ohio Legislature passed House Bill 164, that returned \$181,480.49 in state funding back to the district.

- In December 2019, we refinanced \$13.7 million of the bonds issued in 2017 for the construction of Riverview and Parkside elementary schools resulting in a net present value savings of \$768,776.33 in interest expense over the life of the bonds.
- We are currently assigned an A1 rating from Moody's Investors Service indicating the District's bonds are upper-medium grade and subject to low credit risk.
- Our District partners with Lake Health as its exclusive Healthcare Sponsor of the District. Lake Health has agreed to pay the District \$230,000 over a 10-year period. These funds helped pay for turfing the football field at Riverside Stadium.
- As a member of the Lake County Schools Council, a health consortium consisting of 12 school districts in Northeast Ohio, we are able to offer employees a competitive benefits package in a cost efficient
- Through effective utilization of interest bearing accounts and allowable investments, we earned \$307,791 in interest income on its operating cash balances plus an additional \$249,179 on our construction fund.

# Parent and Community Involvement



Educational experiences are enhanced by partnerships between the school district and the community.

We are fortunate to have very involved Parent Teacher Organizations for each of our elementary schools and middle school as well as Booster Clubs for all of our high school athletic programs. These groups host a variety of events and fundraisers throughout the year to provide additional resources for our students, staff and athletes.

**Community partnerships** also allow for additional educational opportunities for all our students districtwide. Highlights include:

- Coordinating student-activities with local organizations such as Kids Love Musicals, Lake County YMCA, Lake County Metroparks, Morley Library, Great Lakes Theater, Just Run and more!
- Teaming up with local first responders, which allows fire fighters and law enforcement officials to visit the schools for Lunch with Law Enforcement, CPR Training, Fire Safety classes, Mock Crashes and more.
- Local business owners visiting schools to speak with students about career choices.
- Celebrating local veterans by inviting them into our schools to honor them through various programs and events.

**Community Events** allow for local families to visit our schools and participate in fun activities including:


- A Community Easter Egg Hunt hosted by the Riverside Parent Teacher Association every Spring.
- Halls of Holly, a holiday event coordinated by Riverside High School students.
- Walk to School Days at our elementary schools.
- Senior Citizen Appreciation Nights, which include a free dinner and free preview of the high school's fall play and spring musical.
- In 2019, we hosted a Community-Wide Open house for our two new elementary schools, Parkside and Riverview.
- In 2019, we hosted a grand opening event for our Veterans Wall of Honor, located inside of Riverside Stadium.
- All of our PTA and Booster groups host a variety of other family and community events including dances, restaurant nights, field days, carnivals, game and movie nights, auctions, book fairs, skating and bowling parties, and more!





## **Student Services**

A variety of services provides options to ensure all students receive individualized instruction, enrichment and support.



- Our District provides services to meet the individual needs of ALL students. In addition to regular education services, Riverside offers identification of and services to gifted students, special needs students and students for whom English is their second language.
- We partner with the ESC of the Western Reserve to offer vocational programming for high school students with disabilities. The RAVE Program (Reaching to Achieve Vocational Excellence) is aligned with Ohio's Employment First Initiative.
- We offer a developmentally integrated preschool program serving typical preschool students and preschool students with special needs.



### Student Services include, but are not limited to:

- School Counselors available for all students in grades 6-12.
- Mental health services provided by Crossroads for students, K-12, with social emotional needs.
- Reading tutors for students identified 'at-risk'.
- Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) programs used in all buildings K-12 to promote positive and kind behaviors.
- Intervention Specialists, school psychologists, speech and language pathologists, occupational and physical therapists are staffed in all buildings to help and identify students with special needs in grades K-12.
- Health aides or nurses are assigned in all buildings.
- Opportunities for students with disabilities to participate in prevocational work experiences and special events throughout the year.

### Alternative Schooling Options are also available such as:

- K'nextions Learning Academy KLA is an online alternative school for students who need credit recovery and/or prefer to learn through online programming. KLA offers students the opportunity to receive credit and graduate from their district of residence.
- Lake Academy provides an educational option for reluctant learners.



# **Staff Leadership**

Student growth and achievement are facilitated by high-quality staff members.



- Our School Resource Officer visits all of our schools frequently throughout the year to interact with staff and students.
- Staff members are continuously learning and staying current through professional development opportunities every year.
- Due to the pandemic, our Nutrition Services Department has been providing meals free to all students.
- 100% of our teachers and substitute teachers are certified.
- 76% of our teachers have Master's Degrees or higher.
