5. Work Session - OSBA Superintendent Search

Cheryl Ryan from OSBA talked about the process for the Superintendent's search. She will gather information from the Board and from various focus groups of administrators, teachers, classified staff and community members on what they would like to see in the next Superintendent. A timeline with dates for application collection, screening and review, and first and second round interviews was set. Ms. Ryan began to collect information from the Board on what they see as key issues in the District and what kind of experience and strengths the candidates should have.

9. Board of Education Committee and Liaison Reports

- A. Lori Krenisky Superintendent's Business Advisory Liaison A meeting is scheduled on January 10, 2023. The Committee members will tour the welding lab and discuss the profile of a graduate.
- B. Scott Fishel Curriculum and Programming Committee; Alumni Association Liaison No Curriculum and Programming or Alumni update.
- C. Tom Hach Buildings & Grounds/Operations Committee; Legislative Liaison The Buildings and Grounds Committee met on December 12, 2022. The new boiler at LaMuth is installed and operating. There are problems with the boilers at Riverview and Parkside. There is one boiler down at each building but the second boilers are able to heat the whole building. The boilers are still under warranty. The committee is having ongoing conversations about the ball fields. Some improvements will be made, but they would like to wait until the new facilities plans have been developed before they do a lot of work on the fields. There will likely be some big changes in the operations of the State School Board. There could be a new cabinet created and many of the responsibilities would transition there.
- D. Jennifer Harden Policy Committee; Booster Organization Liaison No Policy update. Elementary schools are having their holiday parties. The new Riverside PTA is growing and planning fundraisers.
- 10. Superintendent's Report Dr. Kalis reviewed the district enrollment. He talked about the various accomplishments of the fall sports teams and the Alumni Association Hall of Fame inductees. He mentioned that the staff in the district is raising money for various charitable organizations through jeans days. Halls of Holly was back this year and was a great success. The National Honor Society hosted a Holiday Market with more than fifty vendors. Mr. Mayer talked about a Riverside Pulse Survey that was sent out the parents of eighth through twelfth graders. He reviewed the results and shared some comments from the parents. Dr. Basich gave an update on College and Career Readiness. There are new courses offered at Riverside such as the welding lab where students can earn industry recognized credentials. A College App day was held where students can get help from English teachers and guidance counselors with college applications. Alumni returned for a panel discussion about what it's like to go to college. More than 1,000 students participated in the senior project.

11. Treasurer's Report and Committee Update

- A. Belinda Grassi Finance/Audit and Personnel Committee; Strategic Plan Liaison The Finance/Audit and Personnel Committee met in December. They talked about moving forward on hiring a behavioral coach and an Intervention Specialist at Buckeye. They discussed hiring practices. They reviewed the items on the Finance agenda. No Strategic Plan update.
- B. Mr. Platko said administrators will be meeting with NV5 on January 11, 2023, to review progress on the facility plans. The District applied for an additional \$200,000 safety grant and received word that it was not awarded. If the Governor signs House Bill 54, there will be an additional \$112 million in safety funds, so Mr. Platko hopes the additional money will be awarded then. Also in legislation is House Bill 458 to eliminate the August election. The Sheriff's department has some potential candidates for the remaining SRO positions in the district. They will most likely start next school year.
- 12. <u>Public Participation</u> A Painesville Township resident said he attended Riverside and it is not the same. He is glad to hear there is no fighting this year and things are improving. He was disappointed that no one seconded Mr. Fishel's motion so that there could be discussion. He said there will be a letter coming from OSBA to the Board regarding Title IX. He would like to see a copy of it.

A Leroy Township resident was "blown away" by the presentations from Mr. Mayer and Dr. Basich. He complemented Dr. Kalis on his selection of Mr. Mayer for principal. There is so much positive change this year. His sons have something good to say about school every day. He prays the Board can find someone to build on what is being done now.

Another community member agrees that Mr. Mayer's and Dr. Basich's presentations were the best part of the meeting. They were very dynamic and we need to build on that.

A Painesville Township resident said that diversity is a problem in our district. There are only 17.9% of students who are non-white. Mr. Mayer talked about how many people responded to his survey, but that is only 12% of the population. There is only one non-white teacher in the district and students do not have access to her until their junior year. She feels this lack of diversity is doing these students an injustice and we need to widen our employee searches to help these students.

A Painesville Township resident said he has been attending meetings for the last six months and this has been the best one. The focus is on the right stuff. He has a student at the high school who tries to be supportive of the minority students and is told they "hate their own kind". The promotion of family and respecting everyone is going in the right direction.
