3. **Special Reports** – Mr. Lewis introduced Charlie Schar and Jason Lamb who were both nominated for an OMLA award. The students were nominated on the basis of character, scholarship, service and leadership. Mr. Lewis read each nomination letter. The boys will be recognized by OMLA at a breakfast. Mrs. Halsey introduced the foreign exchange students and each student gave a presentation about their home country. The students are Johannes from Norway, Irene from Spain, Felix from Germany, Nina from Brazil, and Ludovico from Italy.
4. **Old Business** – Mr. Fishel read a prepared statement regarding NV5. He feels that they are not effective and we are receiving little for the money we spent.
5. **New Business** – Mr. Hach stated that he receives consistent comments of the current situation of the elementary schools being very crowded. He is curious about the extent of the crowding. He asked what we can do in the short term, but any solution would be at least three years away. What options do we have to expand the space? He requested an update at the March meeting. Mr. Hach also said that the State Board of Education has passed a resolution supporting the Attorney General to speak against the proposed changes to Title IX. The changes create an environment where biological boys and girls would play on the same teams and share bathrooms. Mr. Hach created a resolution stating that the Board agrees with the Attorney General.

Mr. Hach made a motion to amend the agenda to add the resolution.

6. **Board of Education Committee and Liaison Reports**

- A. Lori Krenisky – Superintendent’s Business Advisory Liaison – The Business Advisory Council has provided input and Dr. Basich is working on the Profile of a Graduate. He will present the Profile at a later meeting.
- B. Scott Fishel – Curriculum and Programming Committee; Alumni Association Liaison – The Curriculum and Programming Committee is looking at how to improve academic performance. Dr. Mlakar said they reviewed the course of study document in more depth. The Alumni Association has set a date of June 7 for the Golf Outing. This will be a Riverside only event, not partnering with Harvey’s Alumni Association this year. The Hall of Fame Dinner will be in October. The date will be announced later.

- C. Tom Hach - Buildings & Grounds/Operations Committee; Legislative Liaison – The Buildings and Grounds Committee met on February 13. They talked about summer lawn maintenance and the amount of grass to mow each summer. There is a process to putting in work requests. 377 requests have been submitted since August and all of them have been closed. A company called Vasco has been hired to make what improvements they can to the baseball and softball fields. The kilns will be installed soon at Parkside and Riverview and that is the last thing we have been waiting for. The committee reviewed NV5's report and will hire an engineer to assess the buildings. An RFQ has been developed. Time has been set aside on March 27 for potential bidders to tour the buildings. No Legislative update.
- D. Jennifer Harden - Policy Committee; Booster Organization Liaison – No Policy update. The Boosters will hold a community Easter Egg Hunt on April 8.

7. **Superintendent's Report** – Dr. Kalis reviewed the draft calendar for the 2023-2024 school year to be voted on in March. He said the District has been awarded a \$400,000 safety grant to be used for new secure entrances at Buckeye, Melridge, LaMuth and the Riverside Campus. Our Career Intervention Class has partnered with the City of Painesville to experience the jobs available at the city. They will see all of the jobs then choose one for a long-term experience. Both the boys and girls basketball teams are the WRC champions. The girls basketball team won the sectionals. The swim and dive teams won districts and some school records were broken. Julia Hixson will be competing at the state swim meet. The gymnastics team is the WRC champion. Three girls will be competing at the district level. Fourteen wrestlers will be competing in sectionals. A Buckeye fourth grader competed in the Lake County Spelling Bee. The spring musical will be March 9-11, with the Senior Appreciation Dinner held on March 9. The community Easter Egg Hunt for students in Pre-K through grade five will be held on April 8.

8. **Treasurer's Report and Committee Update**

- A. Belinda Grassi – Finance/Audit and Personnel Committee; Strategic Plan Liaison – The Finance/Audit and Personnel Committee met on February 16. They reviewed the agenda items. They are going to start looking at the Administrative Handbook. Administrative contracts will be reviewed in March for approval in August. They discussed the Frontline time clock system implementation. No Strategic Plan update.
- B. Mr. Platko said a grant that was to be used for bus purchases cannot be used for that due to timing. He is getting input to see what we are able to use the money for. Contracts and new hire paperwork will be streamlined through SCView. The state biennial budget season is starting. Mr. Platko highlighted some changes that are included in HB1.

9. **Public Participation**

A. Public Comment

A Leroy Township resident talked about Mr. Fishel's statement about NV5. He wonders how they can take an 853 page OFCC report and boil it down to twelve pages and come up with numbers that exceed the cost estimates of building a new campus that was on the ballot last year. He feels they are using fictitious amounts for dollars per square foot in their calculations. He said they charged us \$25,000 and he said there is not that much work in this report. He gave an example of the bus garage and what NV5 is proposing is much more than what is necessary in both size and cost. He also pointed out the cost NV5 quoted for renovating the campus classrooms. He feels that we do not need to spend that amount per classroom. He thinks that we need to fire NV5 and hire

Cleora Management. He said he and Mr. Fishel did all the work already and showed a report they created.

A Painesville Township resident said he talks to people in the community and they all talk about Mr. Fishel and thank him for supporting students, parents and taxpayers. He mentioned grants and said there are always strings attached with grants. His opinion is that the schools in this country are failing to educate students. He feels our curriculum needs to be corrected and adjusted. No one talks about where Riverside ranks in education. He mentioned that at a meeting prior to a regular board meeting there was a vote to remove the Pledge of Allegiance from the agenda. He feels that was a disgrace to the flag.

A Painesville Township resident talked about Title IX changes. He said it is trying to protect women but is going about it in a very condescending way. He said the job of the school board and school system is to educate all students in a safe environment. The most discriminated and prejudiced against community is the LGBTQ community. He felt there was an implication in the discussion that this group is dangerous. He said he doesn't care what is done at the federal and state levels, but we as a local community should protect our own kids no matter what they're like.

A Concord resident said he graduated from college in 1972 and he saw Title IX go through its process. He thinks we should get away from the terms "men" and "women" and refer to two X chromosomes and an X and Y chromosome. Physiology is different from identity. He mentioned Caitlyn Jenner and how she can still hit a golf ball 240 yards and doesn't play from the red tees. He thinks it should be kept simple when defining sports teams and someone with a Y chromosome should not be on a team where everyone else has two X chromosomes. People will always be prejudiced against something they do not understand.

A Leroy Township resident said kids don't use the bathrooms at the high school anymore. She said when we can figure out how to make sure the students feel safe going into the bathroom at lunch or in between classes, then talk about something further. We said the problem was solved with all the fighting going on. She has lists of students who still say they go all day without using the bathroom here. We need to address that first before anything else.

B. Public Hearing – American Rescue Plan

The Riverside Local School District has been allocated funds through the American Rescue Plan enacted on March 11, 2021. These funds are restricted to IDEA Part B Special Education, IDEA Early Childhood Special Education, and to support homeless children and youth. The purpose of this public hearing is to solicit input from the public on how to use these funds. Any comment made today or received in the future will be considered when utilizing these funds.

14. RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE OHIO STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION'S RESOLUTION TO OPPOSE THE PROPOSED CHANGES TO TITLE IX AND TO AFFIRM PARENTAL RIGHTS AND LOCAL CONTROL OF OHIO K-12 EDUCATION.

WHEREAS, the Riverside Local School District Board of Education's sacred oath of office is to uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 was enacted into law based on the Declaration of Independence's promise of equal rights to ensure that "no person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." Further, original and existing Title IX regulations acknowledge "physiological differences between male and female;" and

RESOLVED, that the Riverside Board of Education declares its emphatic support for parental rights regarding their children's education, for Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 as currently enacted, and for the Ohio State Board of Education's RESOLUTION to oppose the proposed regulatory changes released by the U.S. Department of Education on July 12, 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Riverside Local School District Board of Education supports the efforts of the Ohio Attorney General in safeguarding federal nutritional assistance for students in need, which may be in jeopardy due to new Department of Agriculture rules; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Riverside Local School District Board of Education calls upon the General Assembly to resist federal executive branch attempts to undermine the original intent of Title IX. The Riverside Local School District Board of Education urges the General Assembly to safeguard the inviolable rights of parents, the innocence of children, the rights, privacy, safety, and opportunities of women and girls in schools and athletics, and local control of school districts as defined in Chapter 3313 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Riverside Local School District Board of Education directs the Riverside Local Schools Superintendent to send a copy of this resolution to the Ohio Attorney General, the President of the Ohio State Senate, the Speaker of the Ohio House, and to the Ohio Superintendent of Public Instruction.
