\$2.5 Million CTE Grant Secured

The Riverside Local School District has been awarded \$2.5 million from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce to expand their career elective offerings. This grant award will allow the District to build an addition on the existing Riverside High School to create space for career education and hands-on learning.

In addition, the grant will fund materials and equipment to further student learning and exposure specific industry needs. While career education has long been the mission of Joint

\$40K Safety Grant Awarded

The Riverside Local School District has been Campus, the Field House, the stadium, athletic fields awarded a \$40,000 School Safety and Security Grant from the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation. This grant award will go toward the purchase of additional security cameras and secure keycard systems.

The secure keycard systems will align with the District's transition to employee identification badges. All staff members across the District will now wear employee identification badges that will allow them to enter buildings in place of physical keys. The badges are also used for printers, copy machines and time clocks. This allows the District to better track and monitor staff entering our buildings and access can easily be shut off at any time. The badges also display the employee's photo so students, parents and visitors can properly identify the staff member.

> The additional security cameras will be high-definition external dome cameras and will provide better coverage around Riverside

and the Campus parking lot.

The Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation School Safety and Security Grant Program assists Ohio employers with ensuring the safety of their staff who instruct children throughout the state. The program is available to eligible Ohio employers who wish to purchase equipment to substantially improve the safety and security of facilities, and to reduce or eliminate injuries or illnesses associated with providing educational services to children.

This is the second time the District has received this grant. Back in 2019, the District was also awarded \$40,000, which was used to purchase bus cameras and radios.


As always, the safety of our students and staff is our top priority. Implementation of these additional security cameras and secure keycard systems will help us continue to provide a safe environment for everyone in our District.





Dave Bors Steps Down As Football Coach

Highlights from Dave Bors' tenure as Riverside's **Varsity Football Coach**

- Winning record of 85-64 at Riverside (overall head coaching career record of 106-74)

Riverside Head Football Coach and Athletic Director Dave Bors announced in April that he was stepping down from his position as head coach of the varsity football team after 14 seasons. He will remain in his position as the District's Athletic Director. In May, Jeremy Ishmael was named the head football coach.

Ishmael has been on the Riverside football coaching staff since 2006 and has been the Defensive Coordinator since 2012 under Coach Bors. Under Ishmael's defensive leadership, the football team had the second-best scoring defense in the Western Reserve Conference during the 2023 season and has consistently ranked as a top 3 defense over the course of the past 10 years. The defense was responsible for 102 takeaways the last five seasons and has scored 17 defensive touchdowns over the past four seasons. In addition to coaching football, Ishmael had previously

served as the Girls Track & Field Coach in 2008 and 2009.

Off the field, Ishmael has been a teacher at Riverside Campus since 2006 and has taught 9th grade World History, 10th grade U.S. History, 11th and 12th grade AP Government, American Government and 12th grade Economics.

Ishmael is following in the footsteps of Bors, who was hired in 2010, when he took over a 2-8 football team and has since achieved remarkable success during his 14-year tenure.

"I look forward to continuing to work with all of the Riverside student

athletes and coaches in my role as Athletic Director," added Bors. "In the meantime, I am very excited to name Jeremy as the head coach of the football team. Each year, Jeremy has been trusted to take on more and more responsibility in the program. He has proven that he is a trusted asset to this program and has earned the right to embrace this opportunity. Having coached alongside Jeremy for each of my 14 seasons at Riverside, I am looking forward to seeing this program under his leadership."

"I am honored to be named the head football Beyond the wins and losses, Bors has been coach and look forward to continuing — and building off — the success that the Riverside program has experienced over the course of the past six to seven seasons," Ishmael said. "Through all my years as an assistant coach, I have had the unique opportunity to experience and evaluate the approach of what makes a successful head coach. I have come to appreciate the time, hard work and dedication that is required in order to be successful in this position."


