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RIVERSIDE HIGH SCHOOL

Celebrating 75 Years!

The 2024-2025 school year marks the 75th anniversary of Riverside High School first opening its doors to staff and students. In September of 1949, a partially completed Riverside High School building of 15 classrooms opened its doors to 374 students in grades 7, 8, and 9. Grades 10 and 11 were added in 1950 and it wasn't until 1952 when Riverside High School had its first graduating class.

Henry LaMuth was the Riverside High School principal and John R. Williams was the Superintendent. Plans for a gymnasium, auditorium and

cafeteria got underway in 1951 and a library, laboratories and additional classrooms were added in 1954. Construction began on the John R. Williams side of the building in 1955 and that building was opened in 1956.

To celebrate the 75th anniversary, join us for a **75th Anniversary Celebration and Open House** at Riverside High School on Saturday, March 15 from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. This event is being put on by the Riverside Alumni Association, Riverside High School Student Council and Riverside Campus and District Administration.



The event will feature a pancake breakfast, tours throughout the building, opportunities to see old artifacts, what's new, what's changed and the chance to catch up with old classmates.

While there is no requirement to RSVP for the Open House, we do ask that individuals RSVP for the pancake breakfast that will occur from 8:30 a.m. – 9:30 a.m. RSVPs can be submitted on the District website.





Improvements Completed, Planned

At the start of the 2024-2025 school year, the District opened up its new security vestibules at Riverside Campus, LaMuth Middle School, Buckeye Elementary and Melridge Elementary. Every building in the District now has two layers of entrance doors with a transaction window in between. These updated entrances allow for visitors to be properly vetted between two sets of locked doors before entering each building. The transaction window allows for visitors to drop off deliveries without ever having to enter the building.

The District has also been continuing to work on the Career Technical Education building addition at Riverside Campus. In the Spring of 2024, the District was awarded a \$2.5 million grant from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce to complete this project. This roughly 4,500 square foot addition is scheduled to be completed and

occupied by the Spring of 2026.

On September 26, 2024, the Board of Education voted to build an eight-classroom addition on Riverview Elementary. Both ThenDesign Architects (TDA) and Cleveland Construction have been hired to complete that project.

On December 19, 2024, the Board voted to approve the District's Five Year Facilities Plan and Beyond — which includes building a 12-classroom addition and new gymnasium at Buckeye Elementary along with various other updates and improvements to all District facilities.

On January 8, 2025, the Board voted to purchase approximately 3.65 acres of vacant land immediately adjacent to Riverview Elementary in the amount of \$75,000 per acre.

Visiting Our Schools?

The District is using a new visitor management system in all our schools called Visitor Aware to help strengthen our safety and security for students and staff. Visitors can now pre-register online via the District website prior to visiting the school to speed-up the check-in process.

Visitor Aware uses facial recognition and an individual's driver's license or state ID to check visitors against national databases before granting them access into the building. Once approved, the system will produce a badge that identifies the visitor.

If not pre-registering online, we ask that

all visitors bring their driver's license or state ID and please allow an extra few minutes for check-in at our school buildings.

As always, the safety of our students and staff is our number one priority at Riverside.
