College and Career Readiness

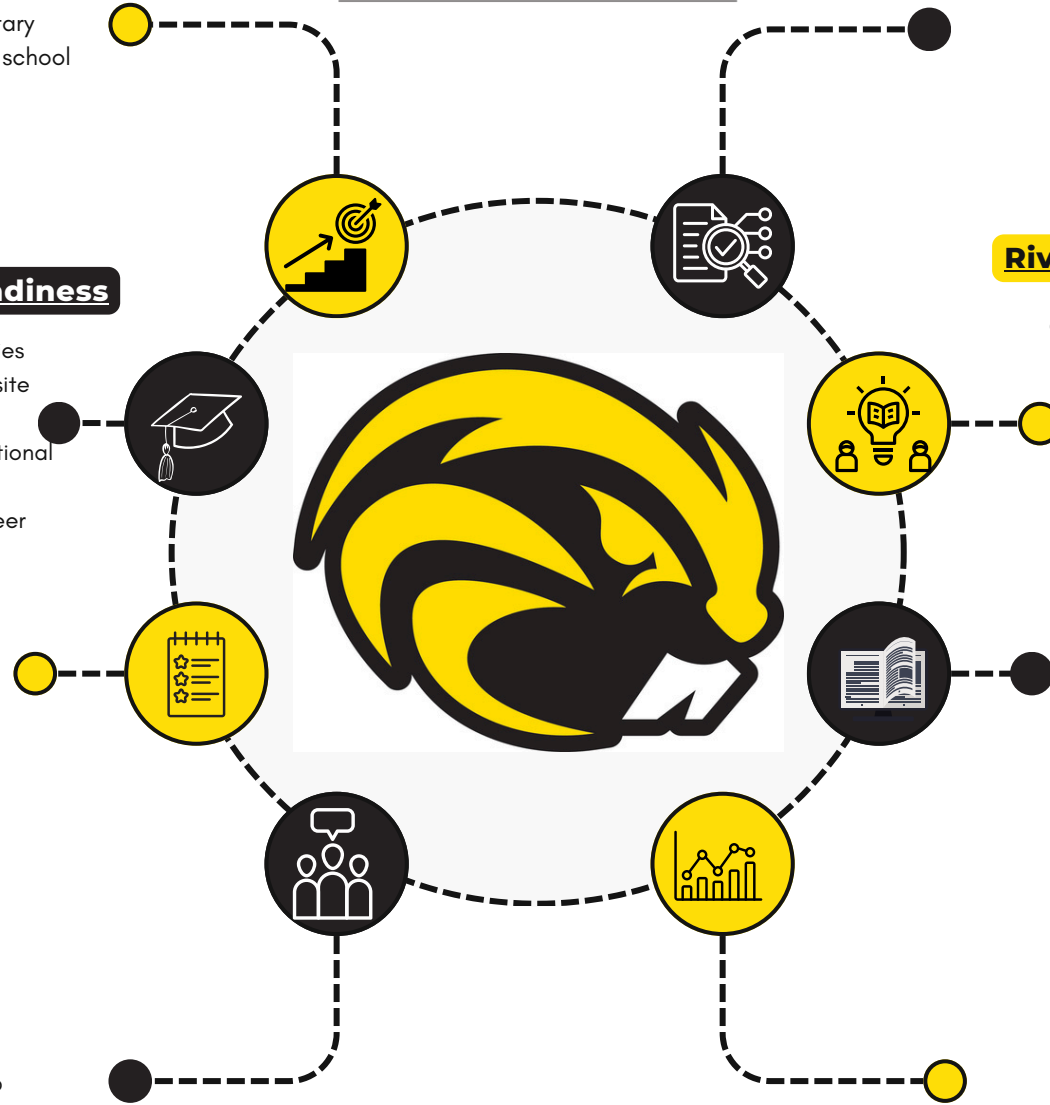
